Pre-Move Preparation (4-8 Weeks Before)

Moving Day: The Big Transition

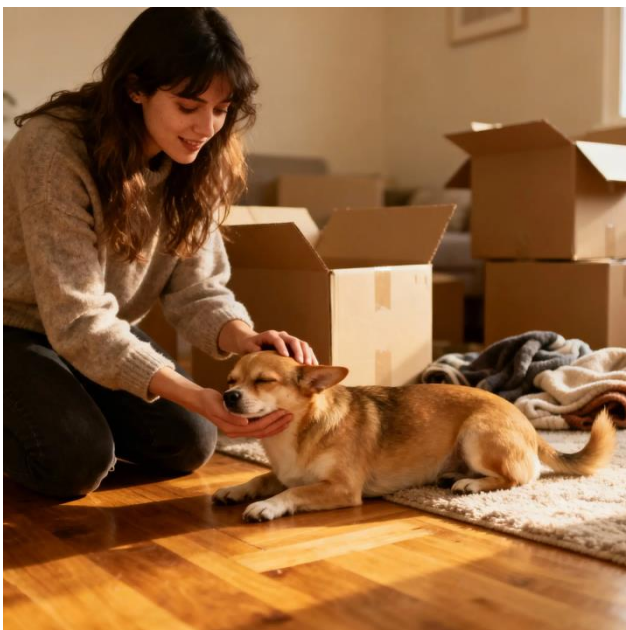

- **Monitor Temperature:** Never leave pets in vehicles unattended, especially in extreme weather. Use climate-controlled transport if hiring professionals.
- **Travel Smart:** For drives, secure crates or harnesses. Stop every 2-3 hours for breaks. If flying, confirm airline pet policies and use direct flights.

Post-Move Settling (First Week After)

- **Unpack Pet Areas First:** Set up familiar bedding, toys, and food stations immediately to create a sense of security.
- **Pet-Proof the New Home:** Check for hazards like loose wires, toxic plants, or escape routes. Gradually introduce pets to rooms.
- **Reestablish Routines:** Resume regular walks, playtime, and feeding to normalize life. Watch for stress signs like hiding or appetite loss.
- **Find Local Resources:** Locate a new vet, groomer, and pet parks. Register pets if required by local laws.
